## Gary Saporetti – LICS Scholarship Award Winner from 2014 by Mary Cae Williams

It was our pleasure, recently, to touch base with Gary Saporetti, who was awarded a scholarship by the Lancaster Italian Cultural Society in 2014. He graduated in 2019 from Drexel University with a degree in Civil Engineering. Gary currently works with the consulting firm of AECOM. The work Gary does includes consulting on roadway projects, site developments and design for contracts secured by AECOM. Their task is to create the final, approved design that is construction ready. PENNDOT, DELDOT, and Amtrak are among their clients. Gary's group never actually slowed down during the height of the Covid pandemic although other parts of the company did see the work flow lessen.

Gary shared a little about his degree work at Drexel. He chose to pursue the 5-year degree that the university offers its students. This program includes extended internships that give students direct, realworld experience in the fields they are studying. Gary completed three internships, in all. "These Co-Ops were great experiences," Gary commented, "What I learned in the classroom needed to be expanded on through direct experience. My internship exposure to CAD (computer assisted design) software, for example, allowed me to jump right in to do the work once I was hired." Gary also noted that serving in the internships is very useful in helping students narrow down their own, personal interests in their fields of study. In Gary's particular field, he gained an understanding of the coordination that must go on between and among many levels of government.

When asked about how the LICS scholarship supported him in pursuing his college degree, he shared a little about how he came to apply for it. Nella Seward is a good friend of the family and encouraged both Gary and his sister to write essays to apply for the scholarship. He decided to research Lazio, the region from which his family came, originally. He had never met his great-grandfather, who immigrated and talking to his father about him helped Gary to get more personal information about his heritage. Writing was not stressful for Gary. At the same time he was researching and writing his essay for LICS, he was studying for an AP Test. The writing actually gave him a break from the stress of studying for the test. It seems that Gary was learning about balancing his energies even in high school.





To this day, Gary looks back on the process of applying for the scholarship with pleasure. He learned so much about the area where his great-grandfather lived; his parents encouraged him throughout the process; he deepened his connection to his heritage. Gardening had always been big in his family. Through his research, he learned about the agriculture in the region and the produce that his great grandfather grew and sold when he was younger.

Gary remembers the LICS banquet during which he was awarded the scholarship. "It was such a good experience and a great opportunity."


