PEPERONI ROSSI (red peppers recipe)

Ingredients: 6 bell peppers, sliced; 1 cup virgin olive oil; ¹/₄ cup balsamic vinegar; ¹/₂ cup bread crumbs, unflavored

Preparation: Clean peppers. Slice peppers in half. Remove stem and seeds. Cut each half into four sections then cut each slice into three sections. Sauté using medium heat in olive oil until tender. Avoid the pepper skin getting too dark. Turn off the heat, add the vinegar, stir to coat. Add the bread crumbs and mix well until all the bread crumbs are coated. Cover pan and let rest for 5 minutes. The flavor gets more enhanced. Place on any sandwich as a filler. This pepper combination can be refrigerated and used for the next few days.

Dante Day by Angela Lonzetta

Dante Day (DanteDì) is observed annually on March 25th. It commemorates what many scholars believe is the day Dante Alighieri embarked on his fictional journey to the afterlife in the Divine Comedy. Italian Cultural Minister Dario Franceschini proposed the inaugural Dante Day, which occurred on March 25, 2020. The day is dedicated to honoring the life, legacy, and accomplishments of Dante Alighieri, and across Italy, Dante-themed events, readings, conferences, documentary screenings, and theatrical performances take place.

Born in the San Martino quarter of Florence, Italy, in 1265, Dante's early life is relatively obscure, with the details known primarily through his writings. Among his many poetic achievements, "The Divine Comedy" was his most renowned work. This narrative poem recounts Dante's journey through Hell (Inferno), Purgatory (Purgatorio), and Paradise (Paradiso), delving into themes of theology, morality, and the afterlife. Translated into over 50 languages, the poem not only holds literary significance but has also played a pivotal role in shaping the Italian language. Dante wrote it in the Tuscan dialect as opposed to traditional Latin, which was primarily used for educated readers. This decision contributed to the Tuscan Dialect becoming the foundation of modern Italian, and resulted in Dante being hailed as the "father of the Italian language."

Composed during Dante's exile in the early 14th century, "The Divine Comedy" is considered one of the greatest works of world and Italian literature. It explores redemption, justice, and the intricacies of the human soul. Dante's physical and spiritual journey through Inferno (Hell), Purgatorio (Purgatory), and Paradiso (Paradise) serves as a profound reflection on the human condition, morality, and the relationship between humanity and the divine. The poem addresses themes of justice, sin's consequences, the importance of free will, and the potential for redemption, leaving an enduring impact on literature, theology, and art across the ages.

In addition to his literary achievements, Dante engaged in politics in Florence, holding various offices; however, he fell out of favor, leading to his exile during a tumultuous political period in 1302. Accused of financial misconduct and corruption, Dante was banished and spent the remainder of his life in various cities, including Verona, Lucca, and Ravenna. Dante passed away in Ravenna in 1321, never returning to his beloved Florence. Despite political adversity, Dante's literary legacy endured. In 2008, nearly seven centuries after his banishment, Florence officially revoked his exile and acknowledged the injustice done to him.




